NCC 2002 DIY Program

If you remember this tech session, you have been a member for some time.

With the encouragement of President Zavala and the rest of our board, our National Capital Chapter (NCC) is reinvigorating our Do-It-Yourself (DIY) technical session program, which allows us to maintain our BMWs under the expert technical guidance of our metropolitan-area BMW dealers. These DIY sessions have been designed for maintenance and simple repairs, which we will do ourselves, with our own tools. We will be using the dealers' lifts, and their parts counters will be open to us, usually with our Chapter discount when we display our current BMW CCA membership card. We encourage members who have never worked on their cars before to try one of these DIYs and learn the pleasures of simple BMW maintenance like oil changes and brake pad replacement. We all started that way.

I've volunteered to be our DIY Coordinator for 2002, and at present we have four DIYs on our 2002 calendar, with possibly more to be added. We anticipate that for our 2003 DIY program we will have eight or more DIYs, as long as we work together to make our 2002 DIY program safe, successful, and fun for us and our BMW dealers. Go-Kart Mini Grand Prix

How would you like to try some wheel to wheel racing without tearing up your precious BMW? Come join us for another day of racing at Allsports Grand Prix in Sterling, Virginia. We have been there twice before in the winter, and have had such a good time we are going again this summer. The format will depend on the number of racers, and is great fun for beginners and experts alike.

The "Mini Grand Prix" format is used for smaller groups of up to 20 racers, and consists of 25 laps for position qualifying followed by a 40-lap race. The cost is \$75.00, payable when you arrive.

If we have enough people, we can go to the "Sprint Race" format, which consists of shorter heat races of about 10 laps each. Everybody gets to run in 5 heat races, with various competitors and starting positions. The cost for this format is \$60.00, again payable when you arrive.

The go-karts are not to be confused with the kiddy karts found at your local tourist trap. JB Racing makes the chassis of these karts in Belgium, and they're equipped with catalytic converters, Caliba racing steering wheels, and Tillett seats. They are extremely responsive, which means that they'll enhance good driving and show up bad driving.

Each racer receives a driver safety briefing and is provided with a race suit, a head sock, protective gloves, and a safety certified helmet for use during the race. You may bring your own helmet and gloves if you prefer.

Drivers must be at least 18 years old and have a valid driver's license. Please be flexible in terms of the racing format, as we cannot commit to a format until we see how many people arrive to race.

From Capital Beltway: Take Dulles Toll Road (Route 267 West) for 12 miles to Exit 9B, Sully Road (Route 28 North). Go 4.5 miles and turn right onto Nokes Boulevard (Route 1793). Go 1.3 miles and turn right onto Cascade Parkway. Go one block and turn right onto Maries Road.Go 0.2 miles and turn left into warehouse parking lot.

From Route 7: Take Route 7 West, go 2.4 miles past Fairfax County Parkway (Route 7100). Turn right onto Cascades Parkway South (Route 1794) toward Sterling. NATIONAL CAPITAL CHAPTER BMW CCA SEPTEMBER 2002 DRIVERS' SCHOOL APPLICATION

- Applications must be submitted on this form and postmarked between July 12 and August 9, 2002. Each applicant must submit a separate form.
 Copies of the applicant's driver's license and proof of insurance (such as state insurance card) must be included with the application.
 Admission will be by modified lottery with priority given to National Capital Chapter members and those attending the fewest prior schools this year. See full details elsewhere in this issue of der Bayerische or on our Web site at http://www.nccbmwcca.org/drivers-school/.
- Drivers must have full, valid driver's licenses. If the applicant is under 18, a notarized parental permission form (available from the registrar) is
 required. One student per car is strongly recommended. Student familiarity with the car is essential. For two-day drivers' schools, first-time
 students may register for the first day, or for both days, but may not register for the second day only.
- Cars must be insured, street-legal, quiet, and must have passenger seats. Functional, securely attached lap and shoulder belts are required for both front seats. The front seats must have equal restraint systems available (e.g., if the driver has a five-point harness, the passenger must have a five-point harness as well). Performance-enhancing modifications and R-compound (racing) tires inhibit learning and are strongly discouraged.
- . Convertibles, motorcycles, and rental cars are not allowed. Trucks, SUVs, and vans are allowed in the Highway Safety School only.
- Cars must be inspected by a qualified service facility before the event. A properly completed tech inspection form (supplied) must be presented
 at the track. It is your responsibility to ensure that your car is safe and roadworthy.
- Helmets must be certified to Snell M- or SA-standards, 1995 or later. Full-face helmets with SA-2000 certifications are strongly recommended.
 The Snell Memorial Foundation's certification will be found on a sticker inside the helmet. The chapter does not supply helmets.
- Prior approval is required for students intending to share cars and for changes in car type after registration.

The National Capital Chapter reserves the right to decline entry to any individual and to any vehicle deemed unsafe or unsuitable for track use.

Admissions Policy

NATIONAL CAPITAL CHAPTER BMW CCA

REV 2.1

Because of strong demand for space in National Capital Chapter drivers' schools, and in order to maintain the quality of our students' educational experience, sometimes we are unable to accommodate all of the students who apply. For schools where applications exceed our school capacity, we will employ the admissions policy outlined below. You are encouraged to consider this policy when applying for future schools.

We have revised our admissions policy for 2002 to distribute drivers' school spaces more equitably among chapter members and, in particular, to reduce the possibility that an applicant to our program will be excluded from all of the year's events. The new admissions policy is based on a lottery system that is operated independently for each school, with admission priority given to students who have attended the fewest schools during the year.

General Requirements

- A separate application must be submitted for each event. Applications must be postmarked during a specific registration period associated with the event. The tentative dates for this year's events and the opening and closing dates of the corresponding registration periods appear below. As in previous years, applications must be submitted in writing on the official application form, which can be photocopied from der Bayerische magazine or downloaded from the chapter's Web site at http://www.nccbmwcca.org/drivers-school/. A check for school fees and photocopies of the applicant's current driver's license and proof of insurance (such as a state insurance card) must accompany each application.
- Applicants may apply for either or both days of each event. For two-day drivers' schools, first-time
 students may register for the first day, or for both days, but may not register for the second day only.
 For the weekend of the Highway Safety School, first-time students may attend the drivers' school
 without first attending the Highway Safety School.

Admission Priority

- For each event, applicants who are members of the National Capital Chapter will be grouped according to the number of NCC school days that they have attended during 2002. The groups will consist of those with 0 or 1 school day, 2 or 3 school days, and 4 or 5 school days. The Highway Safety School will not be counted. An NCC event to which an applicant has been admitted but that has not yet been held will be counted.
- Students will be admitted at random from among the applicants in the first group (0 or 1 previous school day). If spaces remain after all applicants from that group have been admitted, applicants will be admitted at random from the second group, and then so on until the capacity of the school is reached. Applicants who are not admitted will be placed on the waiting list. Within each group, all applications postmarked within the registration period have an equal chance of acceptance, regardless of the date on which they were submitted.

- If spaces remain after all NCC members who applied during the registration period have been
 accepted, then members of other chapters of the BMW CCA will be admitted by the same method.
 Non-members will be admitted to spaces that remain after all members of other chapters have been
 accepted. For the Highway Safety School, membership is not considered when assigning priority.
- Admissions from the waitlist will be by the same procedure.
- Applications postmarked outside of the registration period will be considered if spaces remain after all correctly postmarked applications have been accepted.

Additional Considerations

- BMW CCA members may be affiliated with more than one chapter. Applicants with either primary
 or subsidiary National Capital Chapter affiliation have "NCC member" priority for admission. New
 National Capital Chapter members, including those with pending membership applications, also
 have "NCC member" priority.
- Every effort will be made to notify applicants of their application status three weeks before the
 event.
- The Chief Instructor may admit up to six students who are enrolled in the chapter's formal instructor training program outside of the priority system described above.
- Applicants who are waitlisted and not eventually admitted receive full refunds of their fees, usually by return of their original check.



Peaks of Otter Tour

May 4, 2002

♦he morning of April 20 dawned clear and delightful. It was just right for a trip to the Blue Ridge in our 330Ci. Although my wife primarily uses this car, I do get to wash it frequently and to take it on an occasional jaunt. This was to be the best one yet. Our BMW, probably best described as a Gran Turismo, rather than a sports car, was the perfect car for this route.

Later, I learned that the majority of participants in the Club's destination tours are generally new members who have never participated in a BMW Club event before. That described Barbara and myself, but after this experience, we'll be back again and again.

We arrived at the Cracker Barrel Restaurant in Manassas about 30 minutes before the first car was scheduled to be off. We received the driving instructions, which were carefully prepared by Woody Hair. These were clear, direct instructions with the mileage at each turn provided, not a bunch of convoluted clues that you might get in a rally event. For those who have rallied before, Woody made it clear that we


were not in a race against time and that everyone could take their own pace,

and dreaded gendarmes. Sure enough, we found all three: waves from the Highland School Lacrosse Team bus and lots of cows, horses and dogs at various locations. It tuned out that there were only a few radar traps and I don't believe anyone in the group was pulled over. I took a few pictures of the cars (and one motorcycle) in the parking lot because rain was forecast for the

next day and the cars would probably not be as clean for the rest of the weekend. Altogether, there were twenty-one cars in the caravan, plus the zvei-wheeler. Unfortunately, one car developed electrical problems in the parking lot and Fairfax BMW had to be called to the rescue. I promise never to wear my BSA t-shirt to a club event again!

Finally, we were off, headed down 29 toward Charlottesville at a leisurely 60 or so, politely signaling passes and staying together, lights on. It was at this point, stuck behind the first of several horse trailers, that we began to wonder about the trajectory of horse exhaust from the rear of the trailer and determined that it depended on the rate of acceleration of the trailer. We passed, only to come up on a

new, mint-green, T-bird. The great scenery was just beginning. We getting 33 mpg,



Soon enough, (mile 60.4) we made a turn toward the mountains. Now, the pace picked up a little more and we were able to use the Steptronic transmission to some real advantage. (It's a GT, remember?) I received an instant lesson in using the "manual" mode of the transmission because pushing the gear selector forward makes it up shift, including the shift from first to second. No amount of tugging the lever back, like a normal stick shift, would work

in first gear. Thankfully, the rev limiter did its job! However, these twisties were only an introduction to better roads to come later.

The roads wound on and on, the elevation rising and the switchbacks began. We passed by Blue Ridge Farm, which has an astounding Georgian style mansion with many outbuildings, fields and practice tracks (for the horses). We also passed Falcon Court Farm and Mt. Merrie Farm (1831),

which are equally exquisite. This area seemed to be the center of the Virginia piedmont equestrian community. Through here, the route looked like some of the narrow country lanes in the UK. But the string of 22 Beamers (Beemers?, Bimmers?) got the horse-lovers attention and a few waves.

After about two hours, we made our first stop at the Dairy Queen, in Wolftown. Here, we rested and compared notes about the first leg of the trip. But we got going again, quickly, and headed for more switchbacks, more great scenery and the Blue Ridge parkway.

We passed Crabtree Falls, but the observation area was closed for construction. Here, Barbara and I decided to try the access road that leads to the top of the falls. It was a rutted, dirt track, but going slowly, we were OK until we came to the ford. (Not an abandoned car, either) The road climbed so sharply on the other side that we decided to keep our front spoiler intact and we turned around. But too late, we realized that now all of the mileages given in the instructions were no longer any good. So, we sat there for a few minutes adding 4.2 miles to each of the remaining turns. What fun! It really gave the navigator something to do!

Soon enough, we came up to the Parkway through some excellent high(er) speed and well-banked switchbacks. The 330Ci was just asking for more and the parkway was beckoning. But after pushing rather fast up to this point, it was also nice to slow down and take in the scenery. It also happened that setting the cruise control for 45 and leaving the car in third was just about perfect for this stretch of the road. No worries about speeding, but plenty of speed in the turns. We went on like this for what must have been twenty miles. When we reached the highest point on the parkway, it was time for another photo opportunity. We found the right spot and took our "best BMW picture" for the upcoming contest:

That was at mile 42 and the Lodge was at mile 74, or so, by our modified count. Off we went again, arriving at the Lodge after most of the caravan. Here, we met two other stragglers (Jane and Blair, in his 1999 3 series M Coupe), also first time club tourers, and began the tailgate party. Soon, we found the rest of the group on the lawn, beside the lake.




The accommodations at the lodge were far from rustic. However, the Lodge did keep the promise of no TV or telephones. We all enjoyed an excellent dinner in the Lodge's Dining Room. Overall, this was a well-planned route with superlative scenery, great company and some of the best driving roads anywhere east of the Rockies and west of the Alps.

The next morning, as forecast, the rain and fog began. There we were, over 250 miles down some of

the twistiest roads in Virginia with the trip back to DC waiting. But driving back on wet roads may have been more fun than the trip down. I admit, I never turned off the 330's stability control, but it needed a workout, too.







Sunday April 14th brought us an unexpectedly sunny day and the start to the 2002 Autocross season with our annual Autocross School. Once again, Rosecroft Raceway's lot was converted into a course where veteran autocrossers instructed 40 students on everything from how to start autocrossing for the novices, to techniques on how to navigate the course faster and post a better time for the intermediate drivers.

As with every year, the success of the Autocross School lies with our volunteer instructors who selflessly spend all day instructing. Thanks again, you know who you guys are! We couldn't pull it off without you!

Even if you missed the Autocross School, we always have experienced autocrossers at our events who can lend a hand or offer some advice. Autocrossing may seem daunting at first with a sea of orange cones in a parking lot, but it's not very difficult at all. And it's tremendous fun. The 80 or 90 autocrossers at our regular events are a testament to that!

Creating Corner Carvers — NCC 2002 Autocross School A Student's Perspective:

April 14 2002 was a very hot day, not just in terms of the sweltering sun but also my ever-balding tires as my eager M3 LTW and I proceeded to slice through an endless sea of orange cones on our journey from the starting gate to the stop garage at this years NCC autocross school.

The event was truly remarkable and the value is definitely unmatched as it is rare to find a full day of instruction and personal vehicle thrashing for the meager sum of 15 dollars.

This was the first autocross school I had ever attended so my expectations were high and since I had done a couple of autocrosses just prior, I was very excited to get out there and learn even more from guys who drive similar cars and have been autocrossing for years. Although there were a lot of students compared to the number of instructors, the personal attention and instruction was well sorted and proved to be a valuable resource leaving the students with a better strategy and broader skill set when tackling their next autocross course. The school also addressed many of the bad habits and common errors involved with high performance driving and given that the students had an open mind toward absorption of information, they could have ironed out some of the kinks in their driving style by the end of the day! Another interesting point is that you really work on car control out there while focusing on tuning your technique rather than tuning the car for optimal performance, which makes for helpful and effective instruction during the primary stages of any learning curve. Now all that is left is seat time which is perhaps the most critical factor in improving someone's driving along with proper training and patience and I for one am looking forward to getting as much as possible!

As a recent member to the BMW CCA and the NCC chapter, I can say we definitely have a fantastic car club. One that offers something for everyone from Concourse to autocross to track events/driver's schools all of which I will participate in if I have not done so already. The folks that have been around for a while are indeed a valuable resource for newcomers and that friendly interaction and camaraderie is a fundamental cornerstone in the beliefs of many enthusiasts. Therefore if the main purpose of an association or club is to enrich the value of its membership then NCC is certainly doing a fine job so keep up the good work!



Our Car of The Month for July belongs to the Club's Past President Michael Wendell. Built for the express purpose of competing as an ITB racer in the SCCA's local road racing series, it began life as a simple 1984 318i. Upon that base, Michael added a full Ground Control coilover suspension and camber plates, Eibach swaybars and Koni struts. The requisite safety gear, a cage, harness and seat, were added, and the car was stripped down to the lowest legal weight for the class. The class requires that the engine remain mostly stock, and it has, but Supersprint headers and a K&N intake give it a bit of a boost. One killer modification is in the rear; the car has been fitted with a 4.44:1 ratio rear with a Quaife differential. This setup allows Michael to take advantage of the car's fifth gear on the straights, and keep the revs high coming out of the corners. It must have worked because Michael has finished as high as second when racing in the MARRS series out at Summit Point. One last thing... If you're interested in racing, this car is for sale. See the Classifieds section for more details.

Unless you've been out of the country the last six months, you probably know professional sports car racing is coming to Washington July 19 through 21. It's offically known as the Cadillac Grand Prix and will feature a 2-hour, 45-minute American Le Mans Series race on Sunday. A 1.7 mile road course has been paved through the north parking lots of RFK Stadium. Those of you that remember the old 1.7 mile road course in Upper Marlboro will note the similar layout that wraps around itself several times.

In addition to the ALMS event, there will be support races for both classes (Touring and GT) of the Speed SCCA World Challenge series, the SCCA Trans-Am series, and a "celebrity pro-am" event. I wonder if they'll be in Cadillacs.

The ALMS race features four classes. The Le Mans Prototype 900 class has been dominated by the Audi R8s for the last couple of years, but a Panoz powered by a Ford V8 took the win at Sears Point in mid-May. Except for Formula One, these Audis are the most technically advanced race cars on the planet, and the factory's annual budget is said to run to 100 million dollars. The LMP 675 class is also for all-out race cars, but with are lighter and have less powerful engines. The GTS class is for production-based sports cars and good completion exists between the factory Corvette C5R, Vipers, Saleen S7, and a single Ferrari Maranello. The GT class is lacking the BMW M3 GTR this season, so there will be a gaggle of Porsche 911 GT3RS cars vs a lone Ferrari 360 Mondeo driven by ex-BMW pilots Bill Auberlen and Cort Wagner.

The 37-year old Trans-Am series may be considered NASCAR for road-racers. The cars only superfically resemble their production counterparts and there are only two V8 engines involved: Chevrolet and Ford. But the racing is great and the cars now resemble Camaros, Corvettes, Mustangs, Jaguar XKRs, and Panoz Esperantes. Ex-BMW driver Boris Said gave Panoz its first win in mid-May at Mosport.

The Speed World Challenge GT class has an unbelieveable variety of potential winners: Corvette 206, BMW E46 M3, Porsche 911 GT3, Audi S4, Saleen Mustang, and a supercharged Acura NSX. Their performance is equalized through weight and air intake adjustments. Look for Jeff McMillan's bright red M3 to be near the top.

Finally, it's the Speed World Challenge Touring class where you will see tons of BMWs. This class limits engine displacement to 2.8 liters and over fifteen BMW 328s and 325s will be running. The 325s have a slight weight advantage over the 328s. Other potential winners are the Intergra Type-R and RSX models, VW Jettas and some very hot Mazda Protoges. Ellicott City's Neal Sapp will be in one of the duPont Motorsport BMWs and Arlington's Rob Hines has moved from a duPont BMW to a VW Jetta. Remember both World Challenge classes run on Toyo T1-S street tires.

Friday will have practice sessions for all classes starting at 8:00 AM. This may be the best day for wandering to all available spectator areas. General Admission is \$20 and will include access to some of the grandstands. Saturday activities also starts at 8:00 AM and will include practice, qualifying, and three races. The 50-minute World Challenge Touring race is at 11:45, the Pro-Celebrity race at 1:00 and the 125-mile Trans-Am race goes off at 2:00. ALMS qualifying will follow and go until 5:10. General Admission is \$25. Sunday will have a 30-minute warm up session at 9:00 and then start the ALMS race at noon. Finally the World Challenge GT race will go at 3:15. General Admission on Sunday is \$35 or reserved grandstand seating ranges from \$65 to \$85. A pit/paddock pass is \$10 per day, or \$25 for all three days. Note that pit lane access is limited to those 18 years old and older. Then there is the \$150 SuperPass that has reserved grandstand seating and pit/paddock access. They say coolers will not be allowed, period. I'd give that a big "Boo!"

If you can't make it, or want to review what you saw in person, CBS will cover Saturday's Trans-Am race live and NBC will have Sunday's ALMS race. also live. The World Challenge races will be carried by the Speed Channel several weeks after the events.

SPEED SHIFTS: In case you haven't been following Formula One this season, first, why not. Second, the BMW Williams cars are in a class by themselves. Unfortunately the Ferraris are in a class by themselves too, and it's a class above the Williams. But there is no doubt that the Williams are faster and more reliable than the McLaren-

. . . . Three rounds of the SCCA MARRS series have taken place - one at Summit Point and a double weekend at VIR. Ed York drove his ITS class ë92 BMW 325is to first place at the Point and one of the VIR events. In ITB, Bill Radford (BMW 2002) also won at Summit Point and one of the VIR rounds. I have not been able to find complete results for the VIR rounds. Lots of chapter members skipped work on May 10 to drive out to Summit Point and take in the One Lap of America time trials. The week-long event included seventeen timed competitions including road courses, two drag races and two oval tracks. The route started in Rochester, NY and got as far west as Albuquerque, New Mexico before returning to Rochester. Winner of the Luxury Sedan class, and 11th overall, and best BMW was the 2000 M5 of Roy Hopkins, Nancy Becker and Adrienne Hughes, all from the Rochester area. Only eight BMWs were entered this year. They ranged from a supercharged 740iL to a 2002, but there were no M3s of any vintage. If the Cadillac GP only wetted your appetite for more professional sports car racing, Saturday and Sunday of Labor Day weekend is the VIR 500 featuring the Grand-Am/Rolex Sports Car series and a Grand-Am Cup for production cars. Several M3s and Z3 Coupes will be running. Locals Rick and Cindi Ellinger (Mercedes 190-16V), Alan Himes and Paul Moorcones (Integra Type R) will be running..... Local autocrosses are getting harder-and-harder to enter these days. The SCCA events at FedEx field allow 260 entries and there is still a faily long waiting list. In the listing of results for BMWs that follows you should note that the April 23rd event was dry for those that ran in the morning and raining hard for the afternoon entrants. In an effort to clarify the results,

the notation "rain" will appear after the names of

the afternoon drivers.....Question of the



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
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
