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LETTERS

I was so thrilled to read Eric Carnell's article *Wby Modify Your BMW* – my sentiments exactly.

I have a 2000 540i (6-speed) that I have had for a year now that has brought me more pleasure than all the vehicles I have owned in the past-put together. And I get to drive it every day! I get 3 BMW publications, and I thoroughly enjoy all of them, but am bombarded with information and advertising on ways to modify my car—even via e-mail.

I have been around and loved cars all my life—or at least since my dad realized that my brother would probably never figure out how to change a license plate—I was the "son" he never had, so to speak. I admit that on the cars that I have owned in the past, there have been a few things here and there that I have changed/modified or enhanced. But this car is the most incredible machine I have ever driven and I have not the remotest desire to change a single solitary thing. The people who design and build these cars have produced perfection as far as I'm concerned—and who am I to mess with perfection? My experience with this car, everyone at BMW, coupled with the Performance Center have done nothing but further cement my *relationship with and love for these cars*.

I also totally concur that people should put their money into BMW CCA drivers' school instead. That is what I did and I am still amazed at what I learned down in Spartansburg, South Carolina, after 35 years of driving no less, not to mention how impressed I was with the knowledge and expertise of the instructors. As Eric said, I have not just become a better and safer driver, but a faster one. It is an extremely worthwhile experience. Water walls, skid pads, slaloms with expert coaching are eye-opening experiences that stick! Small things like looking "through" your turns and processing as much information as possible BEFORE executing the turn are the kinds of details that enhance our driving skills. Every day I am mindful to practice what I learned and every day I am more convinced that "right out of the box" is exactly the way this car was meant to be driven. I doubt that some jockey pushing air dams, spoilers and the like is in the same class as the teams of BMW designers and engineers who know how to make 1+1 equal 7!

I have often commented that there is no work day bad enough not to be cured by my 540i in under two miles. Every time I drive it, I discover yet another small amazing thing or its handling and ability to do anything I request impresses me once again. Modify this jewel? I don't think so. It needs no improvement--right down to the shifter with that beautiful "M" which is gorgeous and fits my hand like a glove. Nope. "Right out of the box" is exactly the way I want it. Thanks, Eric!

It's springtime again, and it's time to get back to autocrossing! Just as we have for the past 2 years, our first event will be the Autocross School. Here, we will spend a day instructing novices getting started with autocrossing, and intermediate autocrossers seeking to get faster. Some of our fastest autocrossers and drivers' school instructors will be on hand to teach, all of them willing to teach you at least some secrets of autocrossing! Students will perform drills on sections of the autocross course in the morning. These drills will cover different aspects of autocrossing, all will be done under the tutelage of instructors. NATIONAL CAPITAL CHAPTER BMW CCA 2001 DRIVERS' SCHOOL APPLICATION

- Applications must be submitted in writing on this form at least seven days prior to the event. Each applicant must submit a separate form; photocopy as needed. Copies of the applicant's driver's license and proof of insurance (such as state insurance card) must be included with the application. Postmark date determines admission order. National Capital Chapter members have admission priority until four weeks before the event. Members of other chapters will be admitted to space available at that time.
- Drivers must have full, valid driver's licenses. If the applicant is under 18, a notarized parental permission form (supplied) is required. One student
 per car is strongly recommended. Student familiarity with the car is essential. For two-day drivers' schools, first-time students may register for
 the first day, or for both days, but may not register for the second day only.
- Cars must be insured, street-legal, quiet, and must have passenger seats. Functional, securely attached lap and shoulder belts are required for both front seats. The front seats must have equal restraint systems available (e.g., if the driver has a five-point harness, the passenger must have a five-point harness as well). Performance-enhancing modifications and R-compound (racing) tires inhibit learning and are strongly discouraged.
- Convertibles, motorcycles, and rental cars are not allowed. Trucks, SUVs, and vans are allowed in the Highway Safety School only.
- Cars must be inspected by a qualified service facility before the event. A properly completed tech inspection form (supplied) must be presented at the track. It is your responsibility to ensure that your car is safe and roadworthy.
- Helmets must be certified to Snell M- or SA-standards, 1990 or later. Full-face helmets with SA-95 or SA-2000 certifications are strongly
 recommended. The Snell Memorial Foundation's certification will be found on a sticker inside the helmet. The chapter does not supply helmets.

• Prior approval is required for students intending to share cars and for changes in car type after registration.

The National Capital Chapter reserves the right to decline entry to any individual and to any vehicle deemed unsafe or unsuitable for track use.

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Shaking the Mid-Winter Blues: A Visit to Performance Technology Group

Well, it's January, the weather is cold and threatening, and it's a week before the 24 hours of Daytona so it must be time to take a drive through the Northern Virginia Hunt Country and visit Tom Milner and his Prototype Technology Group to see what lies in store for this year's race season.

Byron McCauley, President of the Blue Ridge Chapter had coordinated this year's visit the PTG facility and graciously extended an invitation to the NCC to join them on Saturday, January 27th

The day started by meeting up with approximately 50 CCA members in a variety of BMWs in the Galleria Mall in Tyson's Corner. Steven Schlossman lead a group on a scenic drive he had laid out and Chuck Grafton lead a second group on a straightforward drive out US 50. We arrived at PTG in time to greet Milner as he drove up in his current ride, a nice 528iT.

The Blue Ridge group also showed up shortly and between the two Chapters, there were well over 70 cars and about 125 members and friends eager to hear the plans for 2001! As we entered the main prep room we were greeted with the two E46 M3s that had just recently returned from the ALMS race held in Adelaide, Australia, (\$75,000 air freight) and a new E46 body being prepared for the assault on Daytona the following weekend. As we looked around, it was quite apparent that this was not your Father's E46 M3. Sitting on a wooden cradle was a very nice V8 being put today by a group of PTG mechanics. It was, as we were told by Milner, a tweaked version of the standard 5 liter M5 engine.

Milner then gave us a 45 minute rundown on what PTG and BMW Motorsports were planning for the 2001 season. All throughout the informative talk, the PTG professionals were working hard

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to get the car put together, because, as we found out, it was to be put in the hauler and shipped to Daytona on Monday afternoon. We all began to wonder how they could get the car together and out the door by that time. But while Milner told us of the BMW Motorsport effort for 2001 involving both PTG and Schnitzer to ensure Porsche did not walk away with the trophies, the professional PTG crew was building this car before our eyes. This car is not going to be flying the PTG banner, but is a private effort mounted by Tony Jennings and his Bell Motorsport Group. PTG will ensure the car is prepared and Boris Said, Hans Stuck, Terry

Yokohama tires and Schnitzer will be using Michelins. In answer to a question about BMW and LeMans, Milner said that there simply wasn't enough time to prepare an entry for this year, but if things

went well this year, running a car next year could be a possibility.

Milner went on to describe that the M5 engine had only minor modifications for the Daytona effort, including an aggressive cam, new pistons, valve springs, titanium rods, and a dry sump. He also stated that in the near term, about the April timeframe, they would be receiving an all new V8 from BMW Motorsports which will become the main power plant for the M3s this season. It's a 4 liter engine and is significantly smaller in overall size than the M5 engine, which weighs only about 20 pounds more than the current 6 cylinder 3.3 liter motor now being used, so the new engine ought to be really strong. Milner did not provide horsepower or torque figures for the new 4 liter but said that the engine will be shipped from Germany, ready to run, and that PTG would not be allowed to make modifications. He added that the engine was built using proven technology from the BMW Williams F1 effort.

When asked if the future production M3s might have the V8 engine instead of the current 6, Milner would only say that BMW doesn't build race cars with engines that don't someday become production vehicles. When pressed for a timeframe, he would only say maybe in 3 or 4 years! We'll have to wait and see.

The discussion then opened up for questions after which we were offered the opportunity to tour the shop and watch his mechanics getting this car ready to go. As our time at PTG drew to a close, the mechanics had finished assembling the power train and were "stuffing" it in the E46 engine compartment. It fit, but without much room to spare. By the time you read this article we'll know how successful their efforts will have been.

I know that we wish to thank Tom Milner and his staff for allowing us the privelege to visit his facilities at such a busy time in their preparation and we also wish to thank Byron McCauley and the Blue Ridge Chapter for coordinating this tour and inviting us to join them.

I don't know about the rest of you, but I'm looking forward to the 2001 motorsports season for several reasons. Starting with Formula 1, the BMW-Williams team is running a re-designed, lighter V10 engine and tires by Michelin after that company has been absent from F1 since the days of grooveless slicks. Last year's rookie sensation has been farmed out to the Benetton-Renault team for two years and replaced by CART and Indy 500 Champion Juan Montoya. Montoya was a Williams test driver before his stint in CART. The cars will be sporting more bright blue paint on their sleek bodies. BMW-Williams would like to be considered a potential winner along with Ferrari and McLaren, but Jordan, BAR, Benetton and Jaguar have similar aspirations. I have not be able to confirm whether Speedvision and Fox will be the television sources for F1 this year. Since ESPN lost NASCAR to Fox and NBC, is it possible that they will top the bidding for USA TV rights?

The Blue Ridge BMW Club Chapter hosted a tour to Tom Milner's PTG shop in Winchester January 27. Those of us in attendance learned that both PTG and Schnitzer will field two M3s in the American Le Mans Series' GT Class. As I speculated in the November issue, these cars will have V8 engines. I did not guess then would be pure racing engines built, supplied and tuned by the factory in Germany. Apparently the ALMS officials wanted to give the 3.8-liter Porsche 911GT3R's some competition. Schnitzer's drivers will include JJ Lehto, Jorg Muller and Dirk Muller. They will be on Michelin racing tires. The PTG drivers are Boris Said, Hans Stuck, Nic Jonsson, and Bill Auberlen. Of course Auberlen is returning to PTG after two years in the BMW LMR V12s raced by Schnitzer in the Prototype class. Milner is sticking with Yokohama rubber as they have been a major contributor to the team's success over the last six vears. Unfortunately these new V8 M3s are not expected to be available until the 3rd round of the series.

What we were able to see being put together, 48hours before being trucked to Daytona, was a new M3 powered by a modified production M5 V8. See Chuck Grafton's article for more details. This car lead the GT class in the Daytona 24-Hour into the 18th hour before water and/or debris in the airintake system caused engine problems, and the car was retired. It is expected that JET Motorsports (owner/driver Tony Jennings) will run the car in the Grand-American Series, but I do not know if we will see it in any ALMS events.

The SCCA's Speedvision Cup World Challenge should continue to provide the most exciting road racing in North America and maybe even more so with the change in the spec tire. Last year's tire was the sticky BFG g-Force. This year they are going to a street tire with a 280 treadwear rating the Toyo T1-S. Someone said the series will be more like ice racing. More than 15 BMW 328s are expected to return in the Touring class (no 330s as 2.8 liters is the class limit). Last year's rookie of the year and second place finisher Neal Sapp of Ellicott City will be driving a 328 for the Dupont Motorsports/ERT team. His car owner from last year, TC Kline, is expecting to enter M3s in the GT class, but his drivers have not been announced. Chapter member Rob Hines of Arlington will be driving an Audi A4 in the Touring class. Most recently Rob has been campaigning a T2 Mustang in SCCA Nationals.

The professional Motorola Cup series for "showroom" stock sports cars and sedans has been renamed the Grand-Am Cup for their new sanctioning body. Several teams will continue to run 328s and Z3 Coupes in the Sports class. Only one race on their 2001 schedule has a location "to be determined". Hopefully it will be at the full course at VIR. Last year the Motorola Cup cars found the shorter north course to be quite crowded with their field of 54 cars. Rockville's Rick and Cindi Ellinger have switched from the Speedvision Cup sprint race format to the Grand-Am Cup's endurance races for their Mercedes team. Rick finished 4th in the sports class at the Daytona 2-Hour event. Brian and Kristine Shipman and Klaus Hirtes help crew for Rick at Daytona.

As most of the opportunities to watch the races in these professional series will be via television, we also have the BMW, SCCA and NASA club and various vintage races to attend in person at Summit Point Raceway and VIR. The new Rausch Greek Motorsports Park (45 minutes north of Harrisburg, Pennsylvania) is expected to open in early May. Their posted schedule includes several motorcycle races, as well as club auto racing by NASA and EMRA, however so far there are no SCCA race weekends scheduled. Check the Competition Corner Calendar for events that are within a reasonable drive of Baltimore/Washington.

As this column was missing from the last issue (for the first time in 15 years), we have some unfinished business from the 2000 season. The Metropolitan Washington Council of Sports Car Club's championship autocross series saw seven chapter members win class titles. They were Joe Murphy (A Stock '99 M3), Ron Katona (E-Street Prepared '95 M3), Bill Brochu (C-Prepared '85 535i), Gary Lin (E-Modified '85 325e), Bob Hausmann (A-Modified bodyless Triumph TR4), Barry Miles (B-Prepared Shelby-Charger), and Lee Hassig (F-Modified Red Devil F500). Angie Brochu just fell a couple of points shy of winning the Ladies class. Also, Ron Katona put some organization into our chapter's team entry. Knowing before hand who would be participating in each event. Ron was able to select the four team members he thought would have the best chance of scoring the most points. The result was that the National Capital Chapter tied the SCCA for the 2000 team championship.
