

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
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NCC Autocross Series Event #2

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
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NATIONAL CAPITAL CHAPTER BMW CCA 2001 DRIVERS' SCHOOL APPLICATION

- Applications must be submitted in writing on this form at least seven days prior to the event. Each applicant must submit a separate form; photocopy as needed. Copies of the applicant's driver's license and proof of insurance (such as state insurance card) must be included with the application. Postmark date determines admission order. National Capital Chapter members have admission priority until four weeks before the event. Members of other chapters will be admitted to space available at that time.
- Drivers must have full, valid driver's licenses. If the applicant is under 18, a notarized parental permission form (supplied) is required. One student per car is strongly recommended. Student familiarity with the car is essential. For two-day drivers' schools, first-time students may register for the first day, or for both days, but may not register for the second day only.
- · Cars must be insured, street-legal, quiet, and must have passenger seats. Functional, securely attached lap and shoulder belts are required for both front seats. The front seats must have equal restraint systems available (e.g., if the driver has a five-point harness, the passenger must have a five-point harness as well). Performance-enhancing modifications and R-compound (racing) tires inhibit learning and are strongly discouraged.
- Convertibles, motorcycles, and rental cars are not allowed. Trucks, SUVs, and vans are allowed in the Highway Safety School only.
- Cars must be inspected by a qualified service facility before the event. A properly completed tech inspection form (supplied) must be presented at the track. It is your responsibility to ensure that your car is safe and roadworthy.
- Helmets must be certified to Snell M- or SA-standards, 1990 or later. Full-face helmets with SA-95 or SA-2000 certifications are strongly recommended. The Snell Memorial Foundation's certification will be found on a sticker inside the helmet. The chapter does not supply helmets.
- · Prior approval is required for students intending to share cars and for changes in car type after registration.

NATIONAL CAPITAL CHAPTER - FINANCIAL STATEMENT

Each year the Chapter must submit an accounting of our financial year compared to the previous financial year. National tracks certain categories of expenses and income. This information is used to advise chapters if they seem to be moving in the wrong direction, but it is also used to advise potential new chapters as to the level of expenses they can expect for the number of members they anticipate. The NationalCapital Chapter is the second or third largest BMW CCA chapter. That means we can conduct lots of activities and enjoy our cars in a myriad of ways. It also means that we have financial activity on the scale of a small business.

The National Capital Chapter started the year further in the black than ever before. Because our bank balance was unusually healthy we tried a new event and some twists to old events. The summer picnic and RC autocross was a beautiful event on a gorgeous day, but only 1% of the 3800 members attended. The Holiday Party was at an interesting location, there was great food, and everyone who attended had a great time. Where were the rest of you? The attempts to engage more members in activities last year was not successful, as a result we ended the year having spent a lot of money for very little return in overall member involvement. If there are other events you would like to undertake, contact one of the board members. If you would like to organize an event we will advise you on the best way to proceed. If you would like to help with or participate in one of the chapter events we will tell you the best way.

We started the year with \$47,415.90. Autocross income was down last year because we subsidized dinners at some of the autocrosses and took that money directly from the proceeds rather than account for it separately. Which is to say that autocrosses continue to be one of our most popular activities and generates far more money than it consumes.

Advertising revenue was slightly off last year. It is important that when you visit one of the merchants who advertise in the *dB* that you mention how much you appreciate it and that you chose them on that basis. Drivers' schools are our other big event. Most chapters don't have access to a track as conveniently as we do, they don't have the membership large enough to support many schools each year, and therefore they have one school or none at all. It is our good fortune to be able to offer 4 schools each year to the membership. The schools are always full and have large wait lists (enter early!). The schools are operated on a break-even basis when possible. Therefore they are also exceptional values compared to other chapter's or professional schools.

Unfortunately, the Holiday party, the new event, and the changes to old events did not turn out as well as we had hoped financially. As a result, the chapter lost \$9453.19 last year. Which means the bank account at the end of the year was that much smaller. Still, we ended the year with almost \$30,000 in the account! The Chapter remains financially healthy.

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Rain or Shine, We Drive and Dine II Antietam National Battlegrounds and Bavarian Inn in Shepherdstown, West Virginia

ften people ask me how I come up with ideas for tours. I find the most difficult part is picking the destination. Once that's done, the hard part is over. Then there is the date. Last year I chose the day we turned back the clocks one hour. I promised people I wouldn't pick that day again. The only reason I picked late March was because I was anxious to get the snow tires off the car and start driving.

For this year's Spring Tour I had heard good things about the Bavarian Inn for quite some time. Passing it on several occasions, my wife and I decided to celebrate our birthdays there last December. The food was superb and the wait staff excellent. I thought this would be a nice place to go for our annual Spring Tour. After all, I wouldn't invite my friends to a place that I didn't think was worthy of them.

I find that the most fun part of planning a tour is finding the route less traveled. I start by using my computer and Delorme's Street Atlas. I select the start and destination, and then pick points that I want to travel though. I particularly like to follow streams, as they tend to be the twistiest of roads. With Street Atlas I can get a good idea of how many miles the course will be and how long it will take. The next step is to upload the route directions created by Street Atlas into my Gamin GPS. Then I take notes at each instruction by dictating into an electronic memo recorder. Every detail is recorded. Often I'll find a road that has been closed or just doesn't exist. So I either take out a map or look on the GPS for a logical detour. Sometimes those twisty roads are actually a 25-degree incline up a gravel mountain road. Other times the road crosses streams or sometimes the road is such that only a X5 can pass through. But once I have my route rerouted I continue taking my notes. At home I transcribe the instructions into a DOS rally program which creates the route instructions. Then I look at the maps to see where I actually was and if I should explore any other alternate routes.

I started off on this Spring Tour mid-afternoon in early February with snow still on the ground in areas. I was lucky. I only found 2 roads that did not exist from my map and all the roads where paved. But, to my surprise, I passed right by the Antietam National Battlefield. "Neat," I thought. I'll add this to the tour and figure on being at the Inn a little later. That will give people another reason to come out if they don't want to go to the Inn afterwards. Once home I transcribed the route directions and updated the directions on Street Atlas while everything is still fresh in my mind. Distance covered, 100 miles in 2 1/2 hours.

The next available Sunday, with my new route instructions in hand, I go out again to doublecheck mileages and road sign spellings. I find additional

signs to keep people on course. I rerouted a section to take advantage of some roads I used on a road rally a couple years ago and to avoid going through a small town. Everything is shaping up. I stop by the Battlegrounds Visitor's Center to let them know our group will be there and to pick up brochures. Back home I edit the instructions to reflect the new roads.

Just to be sure everyone will arrive at our destination, the Inn, I head out with my wife one week before the tour. A new sign was erected at the start and a Stop sign along the road is now missing. I rewrite several instructions to be sure people don't get lost. We recheck the approximate mileages. Now I start watching the weather report on a daily basis, not that I have any control over it.

There is still planning to do, even one day before the event. Several phone calls to the Bavarian Inn. I fax over the final menu choices, follow-up on Saturday to find that they never got the fax, then I start to panic and give them the new list. The weather looks good for Sunday. No rain but chilly. But no rain. Now I hope everyone shows up.

The day of the event Florence and I get there early. It is freezing. But, did I mention no rain? Is anyone going to show up? I promised 43 people. Then one by one the cars start rolling in. We start greeting our 50 chapter members and collect money from those who will be on the extended tour to the Bavarian Inn. A couple of people will not be joining us, but fortunately some people who decided to join us at the last minute were able to take their places. I give my little speech at the start. I neglected to mention there are no restrooms enroute. (There's always some detail that gets overlooked.) Once everyone is on the way I follow the route part way and detour to get to the Antietam Visitor's Center before the group. I stop off at the desk to remind them of our group. Then at 11:30 the cars start filing in. Relief. They finished. Despite a sign that disappeared from last week, everyone made it. Some of us chose to see a movie while others ventured off on their own tours. Some departed on their way while others continued to the Bavarian Inn for a wonderful early dinner. Thankful that everyone is enjoying themselves it's time to start planning the next trek . . .

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


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abody's ... omnetition: BY WOODY HAIR

The local racing and autocross season has yet to get started as this is written in early April, but some of the professional series are getting to be quite interesting for BMW fans. Foremost is the Formula 1 series. Through three races the BMW-Williams driven by Ralf Schumacher and Juan Pablo Montoya have proven to be up there with the long-dominating Ferraris and McLarens. Ralf has qualified 5th, 3rd, and 2nd. In all three races he was hit from behind by competitors and saw his chances for a win ruined. Montoya passed Michael Schumacher's Ferrari early on in the 3rd race at Brazil. He led for the next 40 laps before being knocked when yet another competitor hit him in the rear. So despite the poor finishing record so far, the new BMW V10 engine seems to be the most powerful in the series, and the Michelin tires have shown they are up to the task. It should be a most interesting season.

Unfortunately, unless you or a friend have access to the Speedvision cable network, you are shut out of seeing the races on TV. Unlike last year when Fox also carried the F1 races, Speedvision has exclusive coverage of all the events but the USGP. If your cable outlet doesn't carry Speedvision, call and complain.

Speaking of Speedvision, the Speedvision Cup series for Touring and GT cars should give us lots of rooting interest. Chapter member Rob Hines from Arlington did not sign on with an Audi team as expected, and instead joined Ellicott City's Neal Sapp in a Dupont Motorsports/ERT BMW 328. Rob finished 13th and 12th in the first two races (Texas and Sebring). Neal has a 2nd and a DNF. There will be three Speedvision Cup races within a halfway reasonable drive of our area. Memorial Day weekend there is one GT race and two Touring races at Lime Rock Park, Connecticut as part of the Grand-Am race weekend. The first weekend in October both classes will run in support of the ALMS 1,000 mile Petite LeMans race at Road Atlanta, and October 19-20 will conclude the season at Lowes Motor Speedway in Charlotte.

The first of the V8 BMW M3 GTR racers made its debut at Sebring in mid-March. Right out of the Motorsports shop in Germany, it was faster than last year's PTG 6-cylinder M3s and, driven by II Lehto and Jorg Mueller, was faster than the whole horde of Porsche 911 GT3Rs. Fuel economy was another issue and the more frequent pit stops eventually enabled two Porsches to maintain the lead at the end of 12 hours. Read all about it in the Roundel.

Following it's display of speed in the Grand-American Daytona 24-Hour race, the PTG-built. M5-Powered M3 run by Jet Motorsports received both weight and intake restrictor penalties by the sanctioning body. Regardless, the BMW won the GT class at the 2nd Grand-Am race in Homestead Florida.



It started April 28-29 with the Ferrari Challenge for identical 360s, as well as races for historic Ferrari cars. May 5-6 the Vintage Sports Car Club of America will run their usual assortment of classes along with a BMW CCA Club Race. Last year over 40 BMWs showed up for this event. May 10 will see the One Lap of America stop at VIR for two time trials before the Lap Dogs head on to the finish of their week-long odyssey at Watkins Glen. May 12-13 is an SCCA MARRS (Mid-Atlantic) and SARRC (South Atlantic) "double" weekend of

races. A number of chapter members will be competing. Memorial Day weekend the NASA-Virginia Region will host their club races and a high performance driver school for street legal cars. Finally, on Jun 9-10 the 2nd annual VIR Gold Cup Historic races will take place. Headlining the weekend will be the return of Carroll Shelby to VIR 44 years after he won the inaugural VIR race, an SCCA National, in a Maserati 450S. Oh, one other event of interest: June 30-July 1 the Grand-Am Cup (nee Motorola Cup) cars will have an endurance race as part of a weekend of Formula USA Motorcycle road races. To my knowledge it is the first time a professional auto road race has been run in conjunction with a professional motorcycle road race in this country. If you haven't seen VIR yet, there must be some event here to make the trip worthwhile. CRUNCH
