

Autocrosses Numbers 1 and 2

The first two autocrosses of the 2002 Club season were held May 11 and June 15 at Rosecroft Racetrack in Fort Washington, Maryland. We had beautiful weather for both events, and full participation. We fielded almost 90 drivers for each event. Although we had a wait list and could not pre-register every participant, everyone who showed up was able to drive, regardless of the wait list status. The number of workable venues for autocrosses is amazingly small given the number of parking lots in the Washington area, and we are grateful for Rosecroft's generous willingness to host our events.

We were also very glad to welcome a large number of novice drivers, all of whom allowed as to the fact that this was more fun than they could have imagined. What has always struck me about the club autocrosses is the friendly welcome given novices; it is not at all a competitive, cut-throat environment. I think we basically feel sheepish about having this much fun.

The course for the initial event on May 11 was the familiar course used at the autocross school, with an extra jog before the finish and an especially short stop box. That short stop box seemed to be a real challenge, especially for SCCA drivers who have gotten spoiled by not having that discipline imposed upon them. We had a lot of exceptionally fast times spoiled by blowing through the stop box; maybe that is why the times were so good.

The course for the second event was also designed by Andrej Dolenc, but done while suffering a vertigo attack. There were those among us, the author included, who seemed to be unable to memorize this course. But that is part of the challenge. The other part was traction. The Rosecroft lot has a loose texture that really never lets you get a firm grip. As Ron Katona said, "you might as well be driving a 318, because there is no place to put the power down." With all the loops in the second event, and universal oversteer issues, we found that "slow is fast." The best times were turned in by drivers who exercised restraint as opposed to exuberance.

Autocross number 2 also brought a new feature to our club's events: professional photography by BJ Raiford of turn4photo.com. He has posted a couple hundred photos of the first heat at www.turn4photo.com, and plans to be there for us at future events. The photos are available for purchase but are on the website for all to see and enjoy.

As always, both our successes and our failures were warmly applauded by our fellow contestants. The results sheets, which follow, reduce the challenge and excitement of piloting your sliding vehicle through a maze of orange cones to mere numbers or "OC" notations. Behind each +1 or OC, though, there is a humbling lesson taught the driver about the laws of physics.





ne of the most important responsibilities of a marque club is to help its members get to know and maintain their cars well. Our NCC board of directors is reinvigorating our Do-It-Yourself (DIY) program, which allows us to maintain our BMWs under the expert guidance of our metropolitan-area BMW dealers. During these DIYs we do maintenance and simple-to-moderate repairs, with our own tools. We use the dealers' lifts, and their parts counters are open to us, offering our Chapter discount when we display our current membership card. We encourage members who have never before worked on their cars to learn the pleasures of simple BMW maintenance, including oil changes and brake pad replacement. We all started that way.

Our first 2002 DIY attracted nine members to BMW of Fairfax on July 20th, bringing a 323, two 325s, a 525, a 528, a 535, a Z3, and two M3s. We accomplished numerous projects including oil & filter changes; replacing spark plugs and headlight bulbs; parking brake adjustments and repair; brake work including new pads, hoses and fluid; installation of front and rear shock tower and lower braces; replacement of rear shock mounts; and replacement of tie rod ends, control arm bushings, and swaybar links.

We thank the BMW of Fairfax people who helped us: Jay McGovern, Director of Fixed Operations; Dana Novosel, Assistant Service Manager; Parts people Leah Epting, Jeff Becker, and Shafiq Rehman; and expert Technicians Brent Butler, Hank DiToro, and Ron Wagner. With their help and the other folks at BMW of Fairfax, we indeed had a very successful beginning! Thanks also go to NCC members Jared Townshend, Al Zavala, and Rafael Garces, who helped with the wrench turning, enthusiasm building, and administrative details.

We continue with three more DIYs on our 2002 calendar, as listed at the end of this article. (For 2002 fans, there will be at least one at our next DIY.) We anticipate that our 2003 DIY program might have proportionally more events, as long as we work together to keep them safe, successful, and fun for both us

and our BMW dealers. We also want to broaden the DIY "corporate knowledge" within our Chapter, so please be prepared to volunteer to help a little. Our Chapter will gain a lot from our efforts.







The first annual Cadillac Grand Prix is history and by most accounts the event was quite successful. Despite the hot humid weather with a chance of thunderstorms, attendance each day grew to an estimated 40,000 on Sunday. Most of the drivers I talked to liked the track and organization. Boris Said told me it was the nicest streetcourse type track he had ever driven. After walking the outside of the course where it gets closest to the houses on Oklahoma Avenue, I can understand the local homeowners' complaints about the noise. These cars are much, much louder than the noise-restricted SCCA Club Race cars you see at Summit Point. Of course one person's noise is another's symphony. I hope that those neighbors who don't want to put up with the noise will arrange to visit friends in the suburbs next year.

As a spectator there were a couple things I did not like, such as having the view of the race cars obstructed by fencing; and, from many viewing areas, having the lower part of the cars hidden behind walls. It's not the same as Summit Point, VIR or Road Atlanta, but not much different from Montreal's Circuit Gilles Villeneuve, site of the Canadian GP. The Grandstand seats enabled one to view the cars flying by at top speed, watch pit stops, and follow TV coverage via three large screens. Several scoreboards provided up-to-thesecond standings and lap times, but the grandstands offered no relief from the sun, and only the end section closest to turn 1 offered a view of that action spot.

Grassy hillsides overlooked turns one and two and enabled general admission ticket holders to have equal access to these prime viewing areas, with the added benefit of some welcome shade offered by a small grove of trees. It wasn't until Sunday afternoon that I discovered one could walk the entire outer perimeter of the track. This provided some good close views of the turn 4 hairpin, as well as turns five-B, six, and seven. A cheap paddock pass enabled race fans to see the ALMS cars, mechanics, and drivers up close and personal. I don't know of any other big-time race series that gives so much access.

Another thing I did not like was the location of the auxiliary paddock for the Trans-Am, World Challenge, and Star-Mazda formula cars. They were located in the other large parking lot on the south side of East Capitol Street. It was a bit of a walk and far away from the racing action. Some participants told me they liked the room to spread out, but actually thanked me for bothering to come visit.

The concession stands were usually crowded and offered expensive beer and water (well, duh!) and a wide variety of food - as long as you liked regular hot dogs. The food stand in the auxiliary paddock was out of cooked hot dogs at lunch time on Saturday. Trashcans were few and far between; when I finally found one Sunday morning it was already full. At least the portable toilets had nearby hand-washing stations.

We were very lucky it did not rain. The only direct path from the main entrance to the grandstands was along the grassy hillside at turn 1. Over time the already parched grass was reduced to mostly dirt. A good rain would have turned this to slippery mud. I hope they will use some decking on this pathway next year.

Will I be there next year? You bet. Will I buy Grandstand tickets? Doubtful.

As for the racing, it was all good. The ALMS race saw a Panoz beat the heavily favored factory Audi R8 team. Tom Milner, of PTG fame, was acting as an advisor to the team and made the call to bring the Panoz in for an unexpected second tire and driver change. This was considered the move that enabled the Panoz to regain the lead and stay ahead for the duration of the race. Two exPTG E46 M3s (6-cylinder cars) ran in the GT class and were faster than some of the Porsche 911 GT3-RSs.

The Trans-Am race had many Boris Said fans rooting for his Panoz Esperante to overtake the leading Butch Leitzinger Corvette. Alas, it never happened. Jeff McMillin drove his beautiful red E46 M3 to third place in the Speed World Challenge GT race behind two Porsche 911 Cup cars. At least he beat the heavily favored Champion Audi S4s. Guy Pavageau, a National Capital Chapter drivers' school instructor, finished 16th in his Camaro.

Twenty-two of the 45 starters in the Speed World Challenge Touring Car race were BMW 325s or 328s (325s can be 100 lbs lighter). Mark Kirberg from California and Will Turner from Massachusetts finished first and second in their BMWs. The race had a total of 13 of the 33 laps run under full-course yellow flag conditions. Thankfully the organizers made an on-the-fly decision to extend the 50-minute time limit for the race to one hour. There were more wrecks in this race than all the others combined.

After finishing second in the World Challenge Touring Car standings the last two years, Ellicott City's Neal Sapp is having a horrible season due to speed and reliability problems. Then he was injured in a motorcycle accident (he hit a deer) while riding near his home. This caused him to miss the Road America and Mid-Ohio rounds before the DC event. He qualified 14th of 48 despite lots of oversteer, and expected to be fighting for the lead by the end of the race. While he moved up through the field during the early part of the race, a couple of spins saw him eventually finish 24th.

Other semi-local BMW drivers in the race were BimmerWorld's James Clay from Blacksburg and VAC Motorsport's Tony Salloum of Philadelphia. One of my favorite entries was Clare Greenland of Mamaroneck, New York. Clare's blue BMW 325 stood out in the paddock for the lack of sponsor decals, fancy canopy or uniformed crew. The car was brought on an open trailer pulled by an Econoline Van. Only Clare and a buddy made up his team. He qualified 35th and finished 22nd after turning faster race laps than his qualifying effort. Clare was one of six African-American drivers in the race.

SPEC E30 CLASS - There is a strong move afoot to start a new racing class for E30 3-series BMWs, both 325s and 318s. The M3 and 4-wheel drive iX are not included. These cars were sold in the US market as model years 1984 to 1991. There will actually be two sub-classes. GT is for the 318i (8-valves) and 325s with "eta" 6-cylinder engines, and GTS is for the 325i, is, and '91 318i and is (16-valves). Like the already successful Spec RX7 and Spec Miata, the idea is to provide truly cheap racing in cars with very limited modifications so the cars will be as equal as possible.

Tentative rules state the engines must remain stock except for air filters and computer chips. Any exhaust system after the manifold may be used. Specified suspension parts, wheels and tires must be used: H&R Race springs, Bilstein Sport struts and shocks, Racing Dynamics anti-roll bars, and Kumho V700 tires in a 205/55VR-14 size on the cheap, and readily available, E30 stock 14 x 6 "bottlecap" wheels. Any brake pad can be used, but the calipers remain stock. Any brake rotors are allowed as long as they are the stock E30 size.

Initially it is thought that the NASA-Virginia Region and BMW Club Racing will be the two organizations with a Spec E30 class. It is hoped that the class will become so popular that the SCCA will be forced to add it to their regional menu of classes. In an effort to discourage "racebuilt" engines, there will be a claiming rule. The organizers can claim any competitor's 'i' engine for \$900 and any eta or 318 engine for \$650. I've noticed a growing number of E30 325 "track cars" at National Capital and Tarheel Chapter driver schools. Maybe this will encourage more of our members to take the next step — actual racing.

Speed Shifts: My comment in the last issue about the BMW-Williams F1 cars being a step ahead their competition (except Ferrari) is no longer valid. Suddenly the McLarens are providing more than enough speed and reliability to match "our" team. Despite winning the pole position in qualifying for five straight races, Juan Pablo Montoya has yet to actually win a race. The rampant speculation at the Cadillac GP is that Tom Milner's PTG team will field BMW M3s in the World Challenge GT class next year. Don't forget the World Challenge and Trans-Am will be racing at VIR the weekend of October 25-27. Hotel reservations are already hard to get Here is an update on the new tracks near us: Summit Point's Shenandoah Circuit is supposed to break ground in August and begin operating next season. The Beaver Run Motorsports Complex north of Pittsburgh is now operating the 1.5 mile North Course, the skidpad, and the kart track. It has been described as fast and fun. I viewed the Rausch Creek Motorsports Park north of Harrisburg, PA in June. The road bed is graded and awaiting a sub-base and asphalt. They are hopeful of a 2003 completion. If this facility is ever finished, I guarantee it will be fast and fun. Club member

Jim Harrison co-drove the winning Porsche 993 in the Summit Point 12-Hour endurance race on June 1. The car covered 469 laps (938 miles) at an average speed of 83 mph, and was 48 miles in front of the second place car, a Mazda Miata. The winning car also turned the fastest race lap at 1:25.8. The second fastest race lap was turned in by the BMW M3 that was co-driven by Neal Sapp and Alfred duPont, but they only managed 90 laps before their day ended. The highest finishing BMW in the field of 50 cars was the ITS class BimmerWorld BMW 325is driven by Barry Battle and James Clay. BMW 325s swept the top 4 ITS positions in the June 16 MARRS races at Summit Point. They were driven in order by Ed York, Brian Shipman, Ted Giovanis and Sam Asinugo. Some new names are starting to appear near the top of their classes in the SCCA and MWCSCC series autocrosses. Among them are Neil Simon (Street-Mod 2 M3 Coupe), Mark Rebano (D Street-prepared 325is), and Wayne Rubain (F Stock E34 M5). Neil took 2nd fastest time of the day honors at the July 14 SCCA event. Well OK, it did pour down rain during the first heat and gradually dried out before the sixth heat in which Neil ran. CRUNCH


