

Come join us for another go-kart racing session at Allsports Grand Prix in Sterling, Virginia. If you have not tried it yet, this is a great opportunity to try some wheel to wheel racing without tearing up your precious BMW. If you have raced with us before, here is your chance to move up in the finish order.

These go-karts are not to be confused with the kiddy karts found at your local tourist trap. These are racing gokarts, which means that they'll enhance good driving and show up bad driving. The track is patterned after the Monaco Grand Prix with a combination of a long straight and several tight curves.

Racers must be at least 18 years old and have a valid driver's license. Allsports requires that each racer participate in a driver safety briefing and they supply you with a race suit, head sock, protective gloves, and a safety certified helmet for use during the race. You may bring your own helmet, race suit, and gloves if you prefer (goggles are required if your helmet has no eye shield).

The format will be determined by the number of participants. We might try team racing this time. The cost may be as much as \$75.00. Participation is limited to 40 racers, with priority going to BMW CCA members first, then, order of RSVP received.

Go 4.5 miles and turn right onto Nokes Boulevard (Route 1793). Go 1.3 miles and turn right onto Cascade Parkway. Go one block and turn right onto Maries Road. Go 0.2 miles and turn left into warebouse parking lot.

From Route 7: Take Route 7 West, go 2.4 miles past Fairfax County Parkway (Route 7100). Turn right onto Cascades Parkway South (Route 1794) toward Sterling. This school will be conducted at Roebling Road Raceway over the Thursday and Friday of December 12th &13th with Terry Earwood as the lead instructor. A race event follows on December 14th & 15th. This event is under the auspices of BMW CCA Club Racing, and is intended to assist experienced Drivers Ed drivers get a taste of what racing is all about. It will be conducted in a very safe, structured, non contact environment. It is open to BMW CCA club members who have track experience and have driven solo in chapter schools or who are instructors. You will be asked to provide the name of the Chief Instructor for the Chapter that you drive with so we may verify your qualifications. You will provide your own vehicle. It need not be a BMW, nor have a roll

cage, only the normal Driving School Safety Equipment is required for both your car and yourself. The car must be safe and solid and pass the standard driving school technical inspection. If you do well and are accepted into the "graduation race" at the end of the school then you are required to have full race safety equipment for both yourself and your car in order to participate. You will have a total of eight classroom instruction sessions and eight on track sessions preceded by an information meeting the night before. The entry fee will be \$500.

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August Drivers' School at the Jefferson Circuit

I'll admit it. I thought that the August driver's school at the Jefferson Circuit at Summit Point Raceway would not be much fun. I had been to five driving schools at the Main Circuit held by BSR and thought that the Jefferson Circuit was for kids. Really. However, my first track session of the day made me a believer!

The Jefferson Circuit is not a kid's course or a go-kart track. It is an invigorating track that can be run both directions, testing drivers' skill on off camber tight turns, tight esses, and decreasing radius turns onto straights. The speeds are not as high, but the adrenaline was high enough. I was able to hit 80mph on the ing 30 minutes. The instructors are very experienced and knowledgeable, affording students the opportunity to learn techniques to safely drive faster instead of just squealing tires. The classroom sessions teach vehicle dynamics and the track line. The skid-pad session teaches car control and skid recovery. The on-track sessions pro-



long straight in my stock 1990 325is, and I was giving passing signals to M3s, so I know it is possible to go much faster than that. Since straightline acceleration excites me less than hard braking and cornering, the Jefferson Circuit offered many great moments. Thanks to my instructor, Eric Carnell, I left at the end of the day a much better driver than when I arrived... or at least I felt that way, similar to the feeling of being a superhero. I felt like I had been granted a special power and must use it sparingly and responsibly.

There are several reasons I enjoy attending drivers' schools. The first is, of course, the driving. The National Capital Chapter of the BMW CCA intermingles classroom sessions and a skid-pad session between four on-track sessions, each lastvide the ability to practice what you learned. The goal is for students to safely learn to be better drivers and have fun doing it.

The second reason I enjoy driving schools is the camaraderie. I enjoy being surrounded by fellow automobile enthusiasts, recounting stories of other drivers' schools, fixing cars, or implementing a modification and discussing the effect. Each drivers' school is a day of friendly smiles and new experiences. Students and instructors are very willing to help one another fix problems with their cars (and their egos). For instance, I witnessed an instructor helping diagnose a problem with a student's brakes, and another student lent the tools to fix the problem. I even got into the act by helping a student who lost a sway bar

bushing on the way to the track; I invented the insta-bushing, created from a one foot length of thick rubber gas line and two hose clamps. How is that possible, you may ask? Well, if you wrap the hose around the sway bar and clamp down the ends with the hose clamps, you have just used my patent-pending insta-bushing. I'm filing for patent protection and am hoping that the royalties will pay for a new SMG-II M3.

Another reason I enjoyed the August drivers' school was the "no brakes" exercise. When I first learned that we would do a "no brakes" exercise after lunch, I was disappointed that I would have to give up an entire session of high speed driving. However, I was in for my second surprise of the day. The exercise proved to be useful and fun; I learned a strategy for judging the duration of time I could accelerate out of a turn before letting off the gas to reduce speed enough to safely make the next turn. In addition, turn-in was very smooth since I was not letting off the brakes as I entered the turn. This exercise also taught me some interesting ways to scrub off speed without using the brakes; techniques that will be useful if I ever debut as a contestant on the TV show Worst Case Scenario.

Although it can be difficult to get into a school with the National Capital Chapter (NCC), I highly recommend that you try. The Driving School Steering Committee (DSSC) and the NCC Officers are committed to creating more openings for students at each drivers' school while maintaining the high quality of instructors. Even if you can only attend one drivers' school, you will be rewarded. I hope to see you at the next event.



NCC Drivers' School, A Student's Perspective

O n the weekend of September 14-15, the NCC hosted a drivers' school at Summit Point. The NCC drivers' schools provide a great way to learn about your car and its handling limits. They allow students to learn how to drive their cars in emergency situations, and they do it all in the safe confines of a race track, where the roads are all very wide, and all the traffic is heading in the same direction.

Over 50 students were hosted by the NCC instructor corps; there were some new faces, including Bob Solomon, who just graduated from the NCC instructor's academy. The Instructor academy is an NCC program that trains some of the advanced students in the BMW drivers' school program to become instructors. Also joining the NCC's instructors was Bjorn Zetterlund, who flew down from the Boston Chapter to join the fun.

The NCC drivers' schools consist of three different activities, Classroom Lectures, Track Driving, and Skidpad training.

In the Classroom lectures, students learn the finer points of driving technique, gain an understanding of the basic physics affecting their cars, and discuss their experiences between sessions driving on the Track and Skidpad.

On the track, students get to drive their own cars with a BMW NCC instructor in their passenger seat. The instructors help the students find their way around the track, then help them develop advanced skills in shifting, braking, and cornering. Students are grouped by experience level, which helps to assure that the drivers on the track are traveling at about the same speed. There are typically only 15-20 cars on the entire track at once, which allows the students lots of room to play with their cars in a safe environment. Students are left to drive at the pace they feel comfortable with, and there are strict passing rules that ensure students can drive safely with one another.

As students progress into intermediate or advanced groups, they learn more advanced techniques, including heel and toe and double-clutch downshifting and trail braking. These skills give drivers better control of their cars, which helps in emergency situations. It also makes it much easier to control a car that is going very fast. Students will notice that, as they spend sessions at these BMW schools, they will quite happily and comfortably lap a race track at very high speeds...No speed limits on this road.

The skidpad is where you really get to know your car. It's a 300'-ring of polished pavement that is hosed down until it's as slippery as ice. It provides a great place where an instructor will help you to understand what understeer and oversteer are, what makes a car skid and spin, and how to recover from emergencies. I can attest to the skills that the skidpad provides. My skidpad training helped me recover a spinning car on an icy bridge last winter.

All of the training is provided by the NCC instructor corps, which, in my opinion, is one of the best in the country. Although they are volunteers, the Chapter's instructors are all very highly skilled drivers. They're trained heavily and tested by the Chapter. It includes testing their skills driving on both the track and the skidpad. Additionally, they spend time working with experienced instructors to assure good in-car teaching skills. They're great resources to help you learn as much as you want to through the weekend.

As students get comfortable in all these environments and become more advanced, they have some different options. Some build racecars, and race competitively in SCCA or BMW Club races. Others learn to teach other students. A third group uses their skills as "professional students". Many enjoy touring to some of the more exciting race tracks in the region, including Mid Ohio, Watkins Glen, Virginia International Raceway, Road Atlanta, and others. Each is a different roller-coaster, and a chance to enjoy your car in a very entertaining environment. If you really want to learn how to drive, you should come to a drivers' school.

The second DIY (Do It Yourself) event went off without a hitch and some 13 participants fixed their own cars and drove them all away in better condition than when they arrived. However, not all jobs were easy as an oil change. For one participant, Rob Williams, the end of the day was drawing near and his clutch pedal was still dead. It is moments like these on which the hack mechanic thrives and which create a love-hate relationship with the car. Rob had decided to replace his clutch master cylinder and slave cylinder, a job that requires skill and patience. Rob spent the first four hours replacing the parts, then found out first hand how difficult it can be to bleed the clutch line. However, persistence prevailed and Rob drove his high-mileage 325ix (that's "ix" not "xi") out the door with a smile.

Many other participants tackled complicated tasks and were rewarded with a job well done. Some of the jobs included replacing fog lights, adjusting a convertible soft-top, resetting service lights, changing transmission, differential, and engine oil, replacing brake pads and rotors, changing spark plugs, performing diagnostics on electronic systems. There were several "extra"-complicated jobs such as replacing rear toe bushings, mounting new tires, and recharging the air conditioning. Although the technicians at


BMW of Fairfax were willing to help, jobs such as these will not be allowed in the future. For upcoming DIY events, participants must be sure that they can do it mostly themselves with their own tools, relying on the technicians only for advice and expertise. We are very appreciative of the time donated by the BMW of Fairfax technicians to help participants complete the jobs they set out to accomplish; especially the "extra"-complicated ones.



The goal of each DIY event is to allow participants to work on their own cars and learn how to do their own maintenance. Many participants took the opportunity to watch someone else work on their car. I spent my time learning about how slippery the floor becomes when you combine one part coolant, one part engine oil, one part transmission oil, and one part differential oil. I think I may have discovered a new lubricant... look for me on the cover of the next *Popular Mechanics*. Luckily, the mop and bucket were always close at hand for a quick cleanup. Unfortunately I cleaned up a bit too much and did not leave enough of a sample of my newly formulated lubricant to send to investors. Although the day was messy, I did successfully complete my objectives. At the end of the day, I and the other participants would have been proud to say, "Look Dad. I did it myself!"

The National Capital Chapter would like to thank the following folks in the service department: Mike Sanderhoff (Shop Foreman) and Ramin Shairazi, and in the parts department: Richard Redfearn and Donald Weishaupt. They all lent a helping hand, advice, and even a tool when needed. Of course their generosity did not go completely without reward since most participants bought parts from the parts department. This was the last DIY event at BMW of Fairfax for 2002 and we hope to be invited back again next year.



Construction has finally resumed on the road course at Rausch Creek after taking more than one year for some environmental issues to be resolved. Construction will continue this fall as long as weather permits. They do not have a planned completion date at the time of this writing.

The North Course at Beaver Run has been in use since mid-Summer. I drove it at an Allegheny Chapter school in August and the 1.6-mile track has some very interesting turns and elevation changes. The 8/10-mile Kart track is in full operation with part-day rentals available, and a large autocross pad has hosted events and schools already. The 2.2-mile South Course might be completed by next year and the two road courses combined will be almost 4 miles long. Garages and a club house/restaurant are also expected to open in 2002.

Summit Point's 2.2-mile Shenandoah Circuit has a legal issue to overcome before construction can start there, but track owner Bill Scott seems determined to get this facility up and running next year.

And what about Dragons Ridge near Williamsburg, Virginia? I think they are still trying to sell a bunch of expensive memberships before we will see construction begin. Their website (www.dragonsridge.com) does not even show a track layout yet.

Speed Shifts: The local autocross season will end with three events on the big auxiliary lot at Six Flags amusement park in Largo, Maryland. See the attached calendar. the SCCA's Carolina Region and the local DC Region are discussing hosting a 24-hour race at VIR in 2003. California's Bill Arnold and Tammi Hull were 5th overall and first in the modern car class at the first running of the Targa Newfoundland. This was a European Rally style event run on public roads. It had special stages where scores were based on the fastest times. Throngs of spectators lined the roads and the participants were hounded for autographs throughout the week-long event. CRUNCH




