## From the Editor

I took my family to the beach a few weeks back and we did all the standard stuff you do on a trip of that nature. We built sandcastles, swam in the surf, grilled burgers and dogs, and, of course, I got caught in a speed trap on the way home.

It's been two or three years since my last ticket, and in that time I have thought, occasionally, about what I might say to the officer when/if I got pulled over for speeding again. Basically, I planned to tell the cop that he had the wrong guy. Sure, I may drive over the speed limit occasionally, but I'm actually a very safe driver. I don't tailgate, I use my turn signals, I don't squat in the left lane, and I don't pass on the right. These things are the basics of safe and courteous driving, and I think ignorance of these four rules probably contributes to a large percentage of the accidents on our highways.

But, you may have noticed that there is a major fault in my argument. The speed limit may have begun as part of a serious effort to help reduce accidents on the highways, but now it is most often used as a revenue-generating mechanism that amounts to little more than a tax on drivers. I wasn't doing anything unsafe when I got pulled over. The weather conditions and visibility were excellent, the road was flat, relatively straight, and had no hidden openings to parking lots or driveways. Our vehicle is capable of safe operation at much higher speeds than I was traveling and I gave it a once-over before we left - including checking the tire pressures.

The problem is those cute little towns on the way to our favorite stretches of shoreline have come to depend on the revenue generated by speeding tickets, and once a stream of revenue is found, the natural inclination of government is to exploit it as much as possible. A reduced-speed zone here, a couple more cruisers there, and a small town can put a lot more money in its coffers. You can't really blame the cop, I'm sure he has a quota to meet, and arguing with him about how safe I am is really pointless, so I took the ticket and even reflexively thanked him.

Speeding is the offense-of-choice for most municipalities because popping someone for speeding is so easy. I know a charge of tailgating, for instance, is a lot harder to prove in court than a radar-documented speeding charge; but it sure would be nice if police departments would hand out tickets for the offenses that I think actually contribute to the most accidents. Ticketing drivers who tailgate and change lanes with no signal may be a little more difficult than nabbing a speeder with a radar gun, but a police department that focuses its efforts on those more-dangerous driving habits is truly fulfilling its mandate to "Protect and Serve" the public.

Because of strong demand for space in National Capital Chapter (NCC) drivers' schools, sometimes we are unable to accommodate all of the students who apply. For schools where applications exceed our school capacity, we will admit students as outlined below.

#### **Priority Assignment**

- Students will be admitted in order of application postmark date from among the following groups until school capacity has been reached (ties within groups will be broken by random drawing):
  - 1. NCC members
  - 2. Members of other BMW CCA chapters
  - 3. Non-members
  - 4. Those submitting applications postmarked outside of the registration period

To expand the ranks of qualified instructors as quickly as possible and thus increase the number of students that can be admitted to future schools, applicants who qualify for the NCC instructor training program (Instructor Academy; IA) or who lack a single IA qualification will be given highest admission priority. Qualification for IA is based on student performance in earlier schools. Detailed information on IA may be obtained at *http://www.nccbmwcca.org/drivers-school/*.

In recognition of the importance of volunteer corner workers to our drivers' school program, two spaces (Jefferson Circuit) or three spaces (Main Circuit) will be reserved for applicants using corner worker credits earned at previous schools.

• Unsuccessful applicants will be waitlisted. If spaces become available after the first round of admissions, applicants will be admitted from the waitlist in order as described above. Applicants who are waitlisted but not eventually admitted receive full refunds of their fees; waitlisted applications will not be "rolled over" to later schools.



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## Loss of a Dear Friend

n Sunday May 30, 2004 the National Capital Chapter, and the BMW community at large, lost a longtime friend in Ron Katona. Most people will remember Ron as the guy with the screamingly fast Avus Blue M3 at our Autocrosses. Even though he had been transferred to Newport News, Virginia, he remained active in our local events. Following a valiant battle, Ron succumbed to lung cancer.

few of us will ever know, but despite it all, he never let it get him down. He was a caring and helpful friend to his last day and was always willing to share his wisdom and experience with anyone who asked, whether it be on the track, at an autocross, or on the many email lists to which he belonged.

The following is a message that Ron posted himself back in December of 1999. I can't think of any better way to remember him.

During his illness, Ron endured physical and emotional hardships

OK, OK, honestly I am 37, in the Air Force, and fly a desk on Ft. Meade, MD. Yes, that's an Army base, er... oops, Army POST! I work HR in an Air Force major command beadquarters liaison office to a large government agency... I'll leave it at that. It's either dull bureaucracy and corporate politics or the most exciting and interesting job I've ever had; just depends what's going on in the world that day. I'll retire May 14th 2005!

I used to operate and maintain radar for the Air Force on bombing ranges and have some really great stories about being shot at and bombed if you ever get me juiced up on a bit of something cold, dark, and frothy.

*Cars? Yup, I've got a couple. Just sold an '88 Mustang 5.0 leaving me with just the two Bimmers: '95 Avus Blue bone stock M3 sans sunroof, and a beautiful and moderately modified Calypso Red '97 318ti that originally came as an Active.* 

Did drag racing a few years ago, now I do autocross and drivers' schools. I love drivers' schools but have been thinking of moving away from the track until I can afford a dedicated track car. Both the M3 and ti are too nice to ball up! I'm really into the autocross scene now and I'm starting to feel like I can run with all but the national tour type folk now.

I used to fly and have a private pilot's license although it's been over ten years since I've flown a plane. One of these days, I'll make another (4th or 5th) visit to Oshkosh. 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# Spring Autocross Fling

The 2004 National Capital Chapter Autocross season is off to a great start. The first two events were held on April 17th and May 1st at the Bowie Baysox Stadium parking lots.

If you think we missed Spring in our area, going straight from freezing cold Winter days to sweltering Summer days, then you must have missed these two events. The weather conditions were almost ideal; tops were down, sunroofs back, and the air was filled with the smell of R Compounds being driven hard mixed with the pollen of the Spring blossoms.

If you have not been to Bowie Baysox Stadium, you need to know that the lot at which the events are held is spacious enough for some nice, lengthy, runs. The tarmac is in pretty good shape and rarely do you have to worry about large chunks of blacktop or loose gravel. The subtle changes in the grade of the lot provide for some off-camber turns and uphill/downhill runs, which gives an Autocross a Bowie a real road-course feel.

The event coordinators did a great job laying out the first two events, each had skid pads and higher speed segments that really allowed you to rev 2nd to the redline. In the first event, one of the long segments was such that I had to shift to third to avoid bumping up against the rev limiter in my 2002tii.

There were a few drivers, like my 16 year-old daughter Andrea Ellmore, who got to put their March Autocross School training into practice for the first time. While she didn't get to do the first event, she

did a great job in the second event. She brought her times down from 76.495 to 68.039, which I was excited to tell her was not the longest best-run of the event.

There were 90 drivers in the first event. James Sheridan ran a 45.049 for the fastest raw time in his 1998 BMW 323is in the Modified Sport class. Other class leads included Glenn Ty in Modified Super Sport in his 1998 M3, Bill Brochu in Modified Touring in his 1985 535i, John Vitamvas in Prepared Super Sport in his 1995 BMW M3, Doug Ellmore in Prepared Touring in his 1974 2002tii, Brian Hair in Prepared Sport in his 1998 BMW 323is, Max Boschetti in the Showroom M Cars in his 2003 BMW M3, and Ronald Bushar in Showroom in his 2002 BMW 330Ci.

The second event had 99 drivers. John Vitamvas had the best time of 51.185. The other class leads included repeats of Glenn Ty in Modified Super Sport, James Sheridan in Modified Sport, and Bill Brochu in Modified Touring. Drivers with their first division wins for the year included Rafael Garces in Prepared Sport, Tyler Stewart in Prepared Touring, Jeff Carr in Showroom M Cars, and Brandon Lindley in Showroom.

I am pleased to note that the club also has a large participation of non-BMW cars in the events, which helps increase the spirit of the events and competition - so register early. The 3rd and 4th events in the 2004 series are to be held on June 27th at Rosecroft and July 18th in Manassas. # Bitten by the Autocross Bug

When it comes to talent, skill, and time-in-the-seat, I am considered a novice on the local autocross scene. I only started participating in autocross within the past year. The first event I attended was the June 8<sup>th</sup> 2003 event at Rosecroft Raceway held by the National Capital Chapter BMW Car Club of America. I was literally shaking with nervousness at the start of that first run, and it showed in a poor elapsed time, but I was assured that my jitters were completely normal and would go away with time. Other than the Corvette that threw a rod, the event went very smoothly and I was impressed that the organizers and other participants were so nice.

In the ensuing months, I researched local Autocross happenings on the internet and registered for an SCCA event at FedEx Field in October. The FedEx lot was much larger than the Rosecroft lot, which made it more intimidating. I also registered for the November SCCA event and managed to get a few of my friends to try it out. My friend Ken ward, who was driving a turboed Honda Civic at the time, loved the event. He didn't finish real well in that first event, but I could tell he was definitely bitten by the Autocross bug.

Over the winter a few of us did some work to our cars, joined the SCCA, and talked excitedly, and often, about the upcoming season. Ken sold his Civic and traded up to a used 2001 BMW 330i with the suspension package. He became a BMW believer in a big way and couldn't stop talking about how much better his Bimmer was than his old Honda. Ken was dead-set on racing his new car in as many events as possible, despite the objections of his wife, and joined the National Capital Chapter of BMWCCA to be eligible to race in their events.

#### The 2004 Season Arrives!


It was a little over an hour drive from North Baltimore to the Baysox field for the May 1<sup>st</sup> event. The first thing I noticed about the field was that it was not as open as Rosecroft or FedEx. It had medians with grass and bunch of light poles, but it still managed to be a long



course. When we walked the course, we saw that it was very twisty and there were a few times where it looped over on itself. After check-in, we walked the course again and waited for the race to begin. I donned my helmet and rode shotgun for Ken's first two runs. Walking a course can give you a good idea of what you might be in for, but nothing can truly prepare you for the first trip around in the car. The turns were a lot tighter than we had seen before and the loop around the middle of the course was a blast!

After I rode along with Ken, I traded my helmet for my photographer hat, stationing myself in the infield to snap some pictures. I was able to catch cars leaving the start gate, coming around a slalom gate, and then coming back through that slalom gate. Snapping pictures of cars flying by with a digital camera can be quite challenging, but I managed to get most of the cars that ran in the first heat. Among the many cars that raced that heat were a variety of BMWs, an AE86 Corolla, a nice sounding yellow Corvette, and a 1981 Cutlass.

Though the NCC BMW events tend to be held on smaller lots, they usually are less crowded, run more smoothly and more quickly, have a friendly atmosphere, and have online registration that does not fill up as quickly. If you are a local and want some seat-time without the hassle of the large SCCA events, the National Capital Chapter BMW Car Club of America offers a good alternative.

WOODY HAIR COMPETITION

Kevin Henry announced our new autocross preparation rules and classes just prior to the April 17 event. After our first two events, for the most, part they seem to be quite successful in providing a nice spread of competitors in each class. There are two new classes for completely stock cars. One is for any M car and the other for non-M cars. Cars must be as delivered from the factory, but normal wear items such as mufflers, brake rotor and pads and struts/shocks may be replaced. Adjustable shocks cannot be used since the factory did not issue adjustable shocks. Wheels can be replaced if they are of a size that was a factory option. Tires must be DOT approved and cannot be R-compounds.

Moving up from Showroom are the three Prepared classes. If you are familiar with SCCA Solo II classes, think of Prepared as a combination of either Stock or Street Touring. Allowed changes include air intakes, engine management chips, strut tower braces, wheels, brakes, seats and steering wheels. The most important thing to note is that you can run any suspension modifications or R-Compound tires, but not both. The three classes will include Supersport for 3-series based M cars and the E39 M5; Sport for 6-cylinder 3-series and Z cars, most 5-series and the M6; and Touring for 4 cylinder cars, slower 5 and 6-series, and 7 and 8-series.

Next is the Modified category which allows any suspension modification and Rcompound tires. Turbo and superchargers as well as engine swaps will run here. The three Modified classes will also include Supersport, Sport and Touring. Cars with engine swaps will be classed based on the source car. In other words, a 2002 with an S-14 engine will be classed as a Supersport M3, not a Touring 2002.

Non BMWs, including Mini Coopers, will now have two classes based entirely on whether they have R-compound tires or not. Results from our first two events can be found elsewhere in this issue.

Racing News: The first three events in the SCCA's Mid-Atlantic Road Racing Series (MARRS) have been run. One was at Summit point and the next two were part of a "double points" weekend at VIR. At Summit Point, Ed York drove his 325is to first in ITS followed by Sam Asinugo and Ted Giovanis in similar models. Brian Shipman drove his 325is to first place in both VIR events, followed by Ted both days. Apparently Ed York didn't finish Saturday's race and was third on Sunday. The highest finishing ITB 2002 at Summit Point was Matt Vilkkila, from Chicago, with a third place. No 2002s made the podium either day at VIR.

Several members had commented on the last issue's discussion about participation in the BMW Club Racing program. Both Joel Gallun and Marshall Lytle have done a couple of events, but both have prepared their 325s for SCCA ITS competition and that is not optimal for BMWCR's K-Prepared class. Marshall has sold his ex-Pat Donahue E30 and is finishing up an E36 for this season. Tom Milner's PTG team has won the GT class in rounds 3 and 4 of the Rolex Grand-Am series. The #21 M3 driven by Bill Auberlen and Boris Said took wins at the 250-mile Phoenix GP and Mont Tremblant 6-hour. Despite previous wins in races of 24, 12, 10 and every other length you can imagine, this was PTG's first win in a 6 hour race. Virginia's other major road-race team, G&W Motorsports of Danville, had their M5-powered Doran finish  $3^{rd}$  at Phoenix and  $7^{th}$  at Mont Tremblant. This car runs in the Daytona Prototype class. Competitor's engines include Porsche sixes and Lexus and GM V8s.

BMWs won three classes in this year's One Lap of America. The competition included drag races, wet and dry skid pad trials and 13 road course time trials. An M5 driven by Rochester's Roy Hopkins won the Luxury Sedan class against two Mallett-tweaked Cadillac CTS-Vs and a new Mercedes E55 AMG. Another M5 was second in class. An E30 M3 powered by an S50 6-cylinder M3 engine won the SuperSport/GT2 Small Bore class. Chapter member Neil Simon and your writer won the SuperSport/GT1 Small Bore class with Neil's newly-super-charged M Coupe. Also, three Mini-Cooper S's swept the podium positions in the Retro Car class.

If you follow Formula 1 at all you know that the Williams-BMW team has not faired well at all through the first seven of eighteen rounds. I guess things are even worse if you are a McLaren-Mercedes fan.

A two-day SCCA National Tour Solo II (autocross) event was held at FedEx Field Memorial Day weekend. Over 350 entries, from as far away as Washington State, participated. Chapter members who won trophies include Lee Piccione, John Vitamvas, and Eric Wong (all E36 M3s) in B Street Prepared, Brian Hair (323is) in D Stock, James Sheridan (323is) in D Street-Prepared, Tyler Stewart (Camaro) in FSP, and John Doby (E36 M3) in Street Modified. The result for all BMWs follows this column. Note the time shown is the total for both Saturday's and Sunday's courses.

The first two rounds of the Formula BMW USA series took place at Lime Rock Memorial Day weekend. Both races were won by Andreas Wirth, who I believe is from Germany. Team PTG had good results for their four entries. Joey Hand was  $3^{rd}$  and  $4^{th}$ , Billy Johnson was  $5^{th}$  and  $6^{th}$ , Tom Milner Jr. was  $8^{th}$  in both races, and Tom Sutherland was  $13^{th}$  in both races. I am not aware of any plans to televise this series, but you never know.

In the World Challenge races at Lime Rock, Bill Auberlen won the Touring race in a Turner Motorsports 325i followed by Nic Jonsson in a Tecmark 325Ci. The top BMW M3 in the GT race was Jeff McMillin in 13<sup>th</sup> place, followed by Tom Stewart of Purcellville, Virginia in 16<sup>th</sup> place. Payton Wilson, a service writer at BMW of Fairfax placed 2<sup>nd</sup> in Monday's Pro Spec Miata race.

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
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
